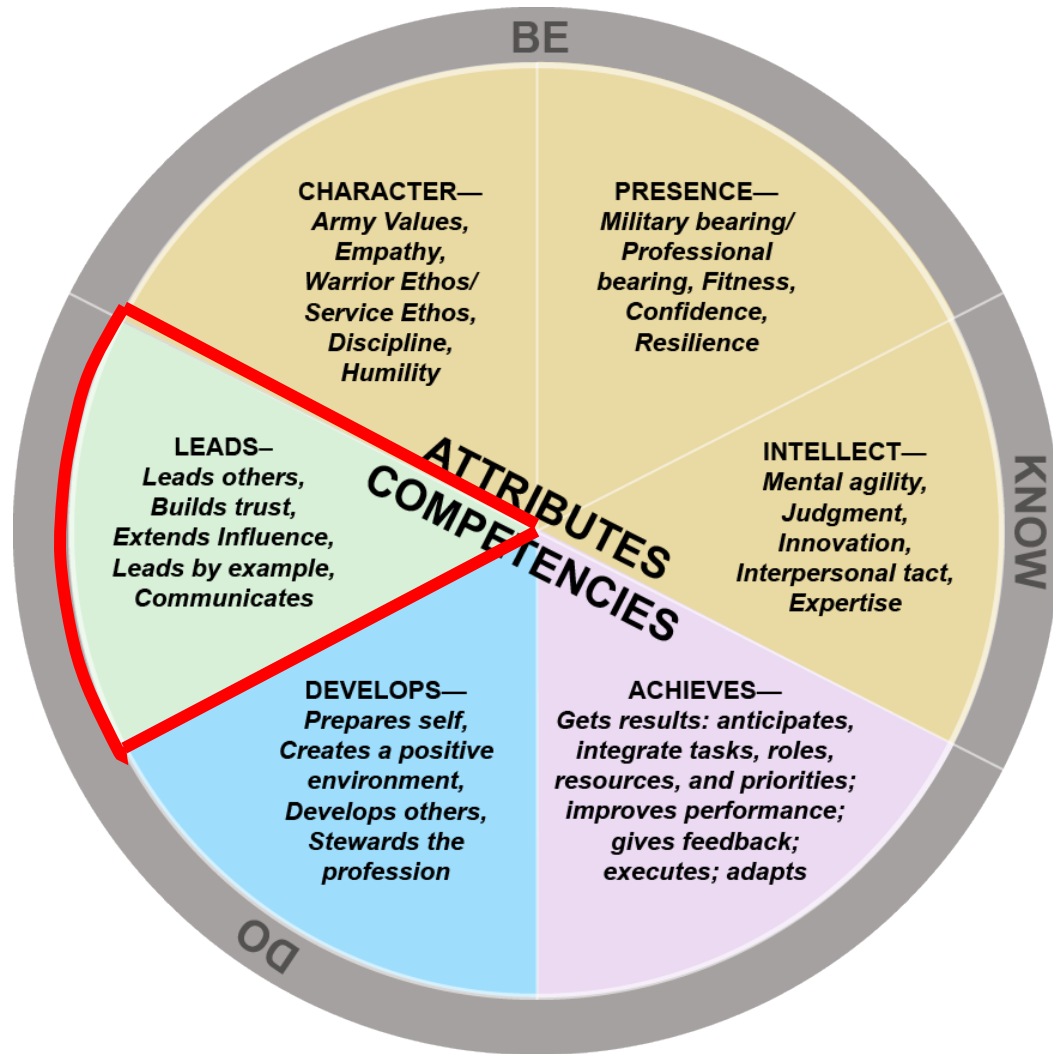

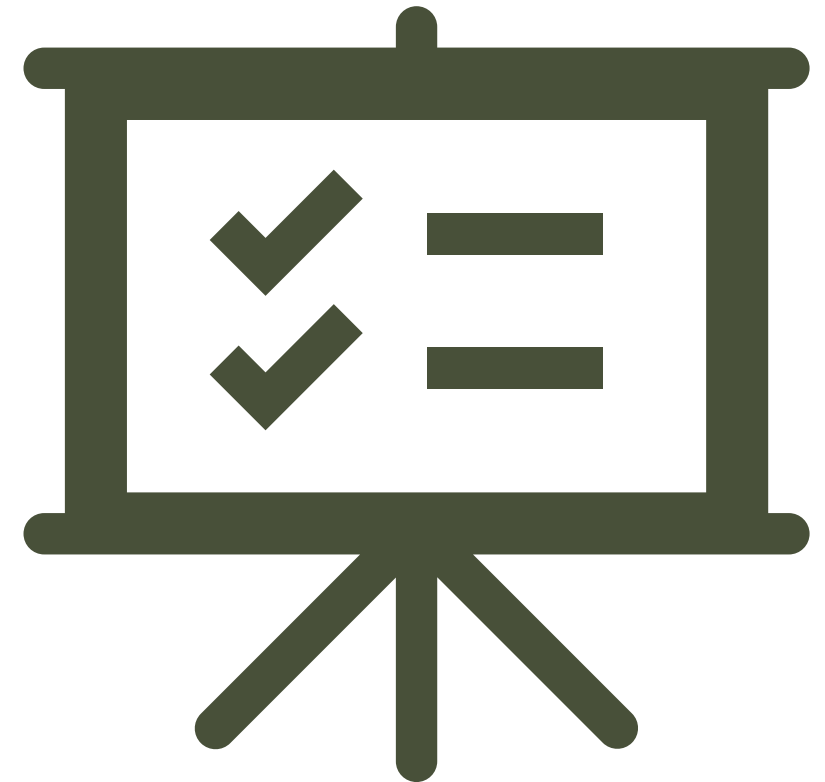
Army Leadership Requirements Model (LRM)

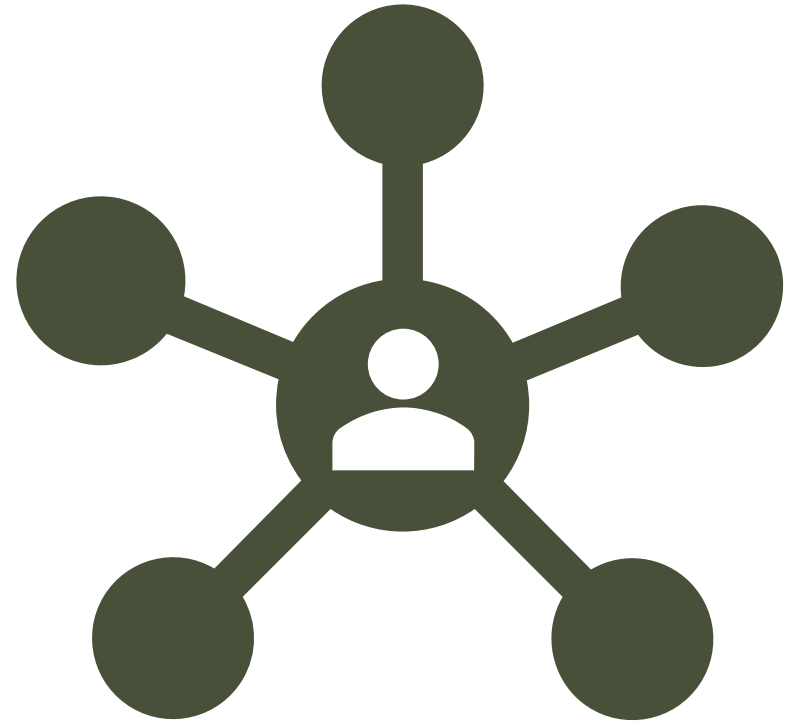

The Importance of Shared Understanding

What Is Shared Understanding

- Ensuring everyone has the same interpretation of information being communicated



Benefits of Achieving Shared Understanding



Increases mission effectiveness



Builds trust with those under your command



Reduces stress within your unit/organization

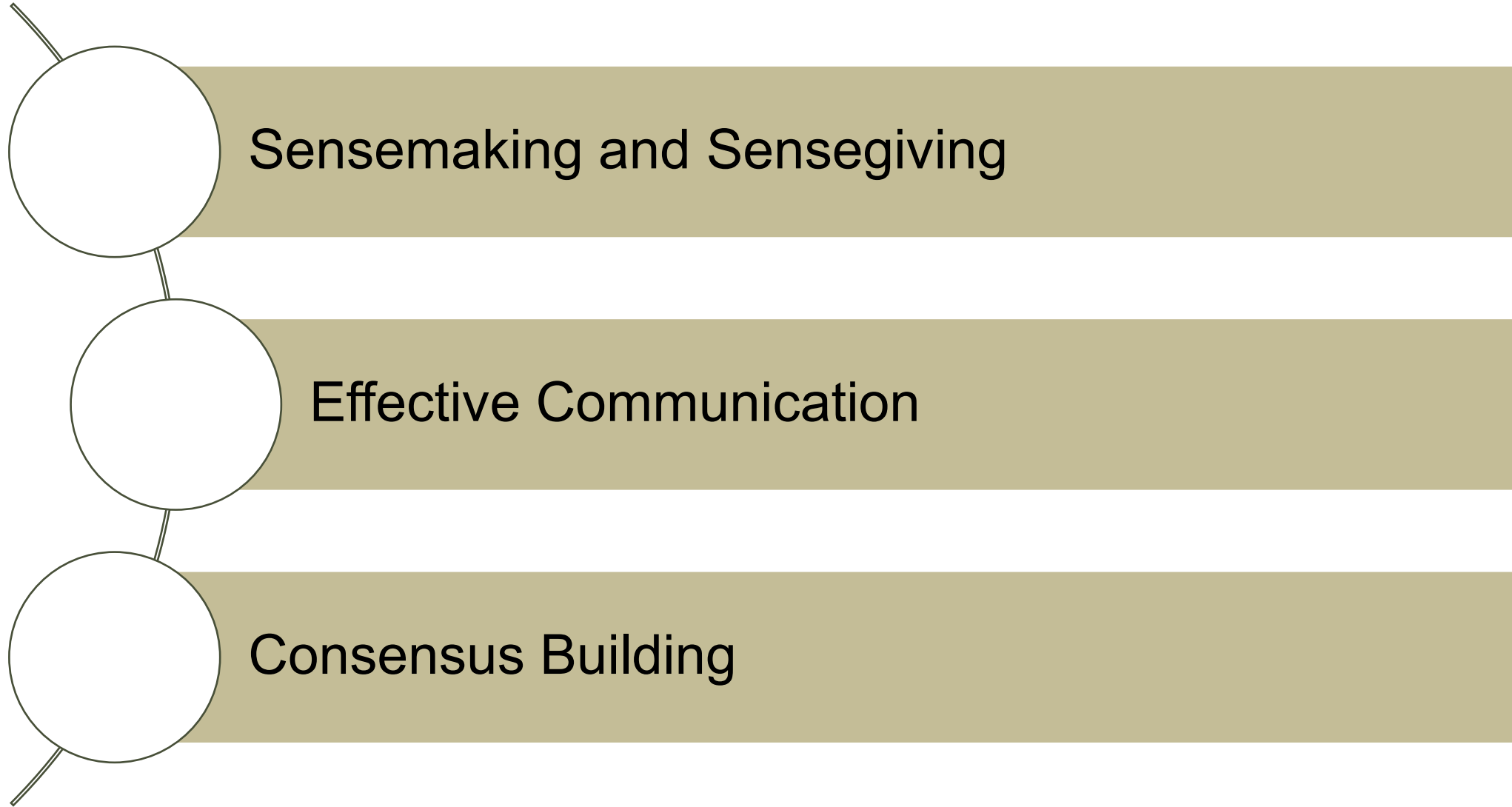

Methods for Achieving a Shared Understanding



Sensemaking and Sensegiving

Sensemaking =
Interpreting events to
understand their
meaning

Sensegiving = Helping
another individual or
group make sense of a
concept or event

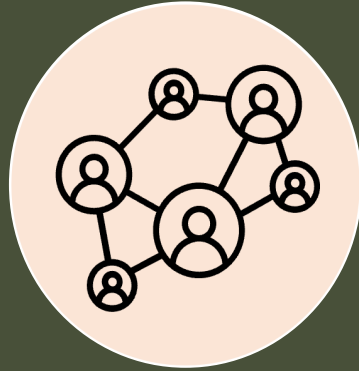
Best used in uncertain or ambiguous situations

Techniques for Sensemaking



Gather information

What is going on?



Create a concept map

How does it all connect?



Examine map for flaws

Is my understanding correct?



Identify possible actions, impacts, and outcomes

What actions are available and what are their impacts?



Continue to monitor and update map

Is my understanding still accurate?



Techniques for Sensegiving

Use open
dialogue

Share
information

Accept input
from others

Disclose
personal
feelings

Use metaphors

Effective Communication

Involves:

- Setting the standards and goals for communicating with those from whom you seek a shared understanding
- Being clear and concise
- Actively listening to others

Can be used:

- Anytime you are trying to convey or obtain information from another person or group
- On its own or in conjunction with other methods discussed in this session

Techniques for Effective Communication

Planning

Set standards

Credibility

Clarity

Active Listening

Consensus Building

- Consensus building is the process of seeking agreement between two or more stakeholders.



Techniques for Consensus Building

Use working groups


Verbalize your vision clearly

Link the present to the past
